Structural work:

- Electrical wiring, plumbing, soak pits and septic tanks work is almost completed.
- Flooring and wall tiles are fixed on 2nd floor . First floor tiles fixing is started .
- Total RCC work is completed.
- Structure of ramp and cold room (previous mortuary) is complete.

Licenses:

- IMA had applied for change of open space from back side to front side on account of topography of the plot and we are unable to take up any structural work in front side of the plot. Approval from Village Panchayat Bandora is obtained.
- We will be shortly applying for licenses with the following authorities :
 - a) Goa State Pollution Control Board for Management of Biomedical Waste generated at Dilasa site.
 - b) Directorate of Foods and Drugs Administration to obtaion licence for Schedule Drugs and Narcotics which will be dispensed for Dilasa inmates and patients requiring Pain relief. Met Dy. Director F D A , Jyoti Sardesai and briefed her regarding our requirements .
 - c) Directorate of Fire and Emergency Services .
 - d) Dept. of Electricity for permanent license and erect electric poles around the campus .
 - e) Dept. of PWD for permanent Water connection .

Managing Committee Meeting of Dilasa:-

Dilasa - Managing Committee Meeting was held on Sunday, 9th October at Farmagudi site . Twelve members attended .

- Review of work completed till date was done.
- Suggestions from the members were taken and discussed at length .
